A PROCLAMATION

FINANCIAL LITERACY MONTH

- WHEREAS:** The United States stands as a beacon of economic freedom and financial opportunity, yet many Americans have a great need for financial education to help them succeed. Financial life skills are more important than ever in helping Georgians achieve their goals; and
- WHEREAS:** Post-secondary education is a crucial asset for every individual and often acts as a strong determinant of long-term success, including financial stability, general well-being, and greater community involvement; and
- WHEREAS:** By the year 2025, it is estimated that 60 percent of jobs in Georgia will require some form of post-secondary education, and a commitment to proper and consistent financial planning is essential in ensuring children have access to education beyond high school; and
- WHEREAS:** The Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC) works to promote financial literacy and provide financial assistance to Georgia students pursuing a post-secondary credential; and
- WHEREAS:** Students can also receive assistance for college through a wide variety of federal benefits, which students should apply for by filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); and
- WHEREAS:** Completing the FAFSA and ensuring a student has applied for all financial aid programs they may be eligible for is a key component of practicing financial literacy while preparing for college; and
- WHEREAS:** Along with financial aid professionals across the nation, the Georgia Student Finance Commission recognizes the month of April as Financial Literacy Month and encourages all Georgia students enrolling at a postsecondary institution to complete the FAFSA and learn more about the available financial aid programs for qualifying Georgia students; and
- WHEREAS:** By gaining a greater understanding of federal and state financial aid, the next generation of leaders will be better equipped to graduate in a stable financial position; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2021 as FINANCIAL LITERACY MONTH in Georgia.
