Dr. Amy Williams is the Executive Director of the Savannah Philharmonic. Over the past four years she has ambitiously and successfully built upon the Philharmonic's artistic excellence and significantly expanded its community impact, alongside Music and Artistic Director Keitaro Harada and the Board of Directors.

Dr. Williams is a true bridge builder in connecting an organization's internal community to that in which it lives, and has striven to be a leader in this capacity throughout her career.

Prior to leading the SavPhil, Dr. Williams served as Managing Director at Camerata Pacifica, where she put in place the building blocks needed to create long-term sustainability. He holds a degree in Advertising from the Pontifical Bolivian University in Medellín, Colombia, and a certificate in Producing and Directing Film and Television from UCLA. Julio's credits include editing the acclaimed film Yellow (directed by Nick Cassavetes), working as editor and colorist on Bullet starring Danny Trejo, and serving as Dailies Colorist on The Menu (2022) and Emperor (2020). His work spans over 40 productions, including Paradise Highway, The Poison Rose, Southern Gospel, A Savannah Haunting, STARZ's VIDA, and the Golden Globes' live digital broadcasts. He also directed, co-wrote, and co-produced his original feature film The Shifting, showcasing his dedication to bold storytelling and independent filmmaking.

Currently, Julio leads the Savannah Hub of the Georgia Film Academy, where he mentors and trains the next generation of filmmakers, focusing on workforce-ready training that bridges education and direct entry into the film and television.
